

Demonstrate how to run various types of software on our Learning Stations

(*** indicates critical skill)

1. ***BASIC PC AND MONITOR OPERATION

- know where PCs are located
- know which keyboard is required to operate each PC
- power on PC from its "off state"
- invoke Windows 10 logon screen
- start "Menu System" software from Windows 10 desktop
- demonstrate how to navigate downwards and upwards in the "kiosk mode" menu system
- close "Menu System" software and return to Windows 10 desktop
- display the numeric keypad application using the Kensington Trackball

2. ***STANDARD ELEVEN53 SLIDESHOW (icon has NO colored dot)

- display next slide and previous slide
- autoplay/pause slideshow
- display and hide thumbnails
- jump directly to a slide by using the thumbnails page
- exit from slideshow/return to previous menu

Example Software: Select "Images of the Eastern Sierra" from the Docent Station main menu

3. ***VIDEO (icon has NO colored dot)

- toggle in and out of fullscreen mode
- pause and play video
- jump directly to different parts of the video
- return to previous menu

Example Software: Select "Rainbow Falls" video from the "Rainbow Falls & Minaret Falls" sub-menu

4. ***WEB PAGE (WEB Browser - icon with LIGHT BLUE dot)

- online web page (scroll up and down)
- go back to previous menu page
- show how to close web page, if it gets locked

Example Software: Use "InciWeb (USFS) Fire Data Web Site" selection on "Weather, Road & Forest Fire Information" sub-menu for online web page example and use "Mammoth Mountain Adventure Map" selection on "Maps & Trails" sub-menu for maps displayed offline example

5. ***ADOBE PDF REFERENCE DOCUMENTS (MS-Edge Acrobat mode - icon with YELLOW dot)

- how to navigate within PDF Reader (page forward/back and go directly a a specific page no.)
- how to zoom in and out on page (magnify and un-magnify contents of page)
- demonstrate starting PDF toolbar
- how to rotate page
- display documents in 2-page mode
- exit using button at bottom of display page or trackball BACK button

Example Software: On the Mining Station, use "The Story of Inyo by W. A. Chalfant" selection item of "Gold & Silver Mining Reference Materials" sub-menu

6. ***INTERACTIVE SKI AREA TRAIL MAPS (icon has NO colored dot)

- how to zoom-in and zoom-out
- how to move map within the display window (up, down, left, right)
- display specific categories of trail & lifts using pull-down menu
- exit back to previous menu page

Example Software: Use either of the two interactive map selections listed on the "Mammoth Mountain Ski Area" sub-menu of the Winter Activities Station.

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7. ***NEW WILDFLOWERS DATABASE -- WILDFLOWERS BY COLOR (icon has **NO** colored dot)
- find flowers using the four sub-menus arranged by color (blue/purple, red/pink, white, yellow/orange)
 - demonstrate how to operate magnify mode
 - demonstrate how to start slideshow

8. PANORAMAS (Quick Time - icon with **DARK BLUE** dot)
- Demonstrate how to start Panoramas Menu Page using wireless keyboard
 - Scroll panorama left and right
 - Close panoramas software and return to Menu Page
 - Show how to close Panoramas Menu Page

Example Software: Use "Lakes Basin from Blue Crag" selection item from within "Mammoth & June Area Panorams" sub-menu

9. USGS INTERACTIVE TOPOGRAPHICAL MAP (WEB Browser - icon has **NO** colored dot)
- Use the numeric keypad application to enter the Host Docent password
 - Display diferent map detail/scale levels
 - Distance measurement tool
 - Spot elevation tool
 - Elevation profile tool

Example Software: Use "USGS Interactive Topographical Map" selection item on "Maps & Trails" sub-menu

10. ***QR CODES

- Numerous QR codes (about 85 total) have been provided for user downloads, mostly for PDF file, but also some slideshows (e.g. CALVO, Wildflower Viewing Locations, Sagebrush Guide, Bodie Guide, Consolidated Mine Guide)
- 3 different techniques for QR Code display (i.e. codes on the PDF index page, codes accessed through button at bottom of page, codes displayed on a duplicate menu page)
- Most pages with QR Codes will also have a "plain english" URL
